

## **GARDEN INSECT PROBLEMS**

SYMPTOM: Tiny soft-bodied insects on leaves, stems, or developing buds.

A shiny, sticky substance often coast the leaves.

CAUSE: <u>Aphids.</u> Red, green, or black, soft bugs. They are 1/8" long

and found mostly on new growth.

**REMEDY:** Most insecticidal sprays, including insecticidal soap are

effective. Aerosol insecticides labeled for plant pests will also work. Follow label directions on all pesticides to avoid plant

damage.

PRODUCT: Insecticidal Soap

Houseplant & Garden Spray Tree & Shrub Insect Control

SYMPTOM: Blooms are shredded, discolored, or buds distorted.

CAUSE: Thrips. Light brown insects, very slender, about 1/4" long.

Squeeze an open bloom and watch the inside of the petals for movement. Thrips move quickly and are spread by

the wind.

**REMEDY:** Apply insecticide when buds are pea-sized, then again at two

week intervals.

PRODUCT: Insecticidal Soap

SYMPTOM: Leaves appear fuzzy and yellow on surface, underside has

small red specks, webbing, or spider-like insects moving about.

(Best seen with a magnifying glass.)

CAUSE: Spider-mite. Microscopic in size, but visible to the naked eye.

They cause damage by sucking sap from the undersides of the

leaves. Mites favor hot, dry weather.

REMEDY: Sprays: insecticidal soap, miticides, or high pressure hose

water. All treatments must be applied from the bottom up in

order to get full coverage.

**PRODUCT:** Insecticidal Soap

SYMPTOMS: Leaves have been eaten, leaving either skeleton structure

or mid-ribs. Unopened flower buds chewed and open buds

damaged.

CAUSE: Beetles. Most notorious is the Japanese Beetle which is

metallic brown with a green head. (Caterpillars can also cause this.) Viburnum Beetles and Asian Lily Beetles have now also

become a problem in our area.

REMEDY: Sprays, dusting powders, or traps. PRODUCT: Safer Rose & Flower Insect Killer
